PROVINCIAL ASF BULLETIN NO. 2020-01

African Swine Fever-Affected Areas with Temporary Restrictions of Shipments to Ilocos Norte

January 10, 2020

In view of the new outbreaks and cases of African Swine Fever in Luzon, with information gathered from other regions, provinces and cities, there is a need to strengthen the provincial borders in order to prevent any incursion of the disease into Ilocos Norte. Thus, ensuring our hog industry and our local pork products to be wholesome, safe and free of ASF.

This Bulletin provides information as to the areas where temporary restrictions are still in place. This also updates the affected areas stated in the Provincial Executive Order No. 29 s. 2019, as indicated hereunder:

1. Province of Rizal
2. Province of Bulacan
3. Province of Pampanga
4. Quezon City in Metro Manila

The affected areas now include the areas below and therefore become part of the areas where temporary restrictions for the transport of live hogs, pork, pork products, pork by-products and frozen semen are imposed:

1. Mapandan, Bayambang and Binmaley in the Province of Pangasinan
2. Province of Nueva Ecija
3. Malabon and Navotas in Metro Manila
4. Dasmariñas, Bacoor, General Trias, Imus, Indang and General Mariano Alvarez in the Province of Cavite
5. Capas and Tarlac City in the Province of Tarlac

Should there be new cases that will occur after the issuance of this Bulletin, updates will be issued to include the additional affected areas.

This Bulletin shall serve as basis for the suppliers of pork, pork products and pork-based products not to attempt to deliver those coming from the above-stated areas, otherwise, these shall be subject to confiscation and condemnation. This will also serve as guide to supermarkets, resellers and retailers of these products not to order the same from companies with meat packing, meat processing and meat storage facilities within the aforementioned areas and within the 1-7-10 km radius protocol on ASF control.

This Bulletin assures the people and those visiting Ilocos Norte that the province's hog industry and its local pork products are free of African Swine Fever disease and therefore are wholesome and safe to eat.
